Average Impact on Weight		
TZD – gain (up to 11 kg)	DPP-4 – neutral	
Sulfonylureas – gain (2 to 5 kg)	SGLT2 – loss (2 to 4 kg)	
Metformin – neutral	GLP-1 – loss (2 to 5 kg)	

Possible Hypoglycemia Risk	
Sulfonylureas – high risk	
GLP-1/SGLT2/DPP-4 – low risk	
Metformin/TZD – none

A diabetes diagnosis is often hard for patients. Here are some tips for your patients to be successful with this change in their lives.

Metformin

- Advise to take with meals to alleviate GI discomfort
- Educate patients on benefits of better glucose control
- Explain side effects when prescribing and at follow-up appointments
- Share that Metformin ER* may have fewer GI side effects
- Start with once daily dosing and titrate up as tolerated

Over 60% of Blue Advantage members who start on Metformin are non-adherent.
