

Radiation Therapy Management







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Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Alabama's **Radiation Therapy Management (RTM) Program** helps to
ensure that the radiation therapy services provided to
members are consistent with nationally recognized
clinical guidelines. It promotes quality and patient
safety for members who require radiation therapy
services. Participation in RTM is required for
Preferred Medical Doctors (PMDs) in Alabama
and contiguous counties. You can determine if
precertification is required for a member's radiation
therapy treatment plan by checking eligibility and
benefits through **ProviderAccess** on our website, **AlabamaBlue.com/providers**, or your practice
management software.

In partnership with eviCore healthcare the RTM Program will utilize disease-specific, evidence-based criteria to manage the appropriate utilization of radiation therapy services and will include medical necessity reviews and authorizations for outpatient radiation therapy services.



The RTM Program will officially launch on December 1, 2014, with a 120-day grace period to give physicians the opportunity to familiarize themselves with the precertification process.

Prior to the May 1, 2015, effective date for eviCore's RTM policies, all treatment plans will continue to be subject to current Blue Cross claims processing guidelines.

| Dates | RTM Implementation |
|-----------------------------------|---|
| December 1, 2014 – March 31, 2015 | Grace Period — Providers encouraged to begin RTM precertification through eviCore. No adverse impact to claims due to RTM. Treatment plans subject to current Blue Cross claims processing guidelines. |
| April 1 – 30, 2015 | Precertification through eviCore required. Claims will be denied if precertification is not initiated. |
| May 1, 2015 and after | Precertification must be initiated and approved through eviCore and treatment plans must be followed. |

There will be no adverse impact to claims due to the RTM Program for patients with radiation treatment plans initiated prior to May 1, 2015, and these treatment plans will be exempt for a 240-day period from initiation. However, a precertification attempt (approval not required) through eviCore is required beginning April 1, 2015, to qualify for the 240-day exemption period.

The RTM Program will address these important areas:

- Patient's disease state and stage
- Appropriateness of technology
- Treatment plan goals
- Nationally recognized standards of care




The RTM Medical Advisory Board, consisting of nationally recognized radiation oncologists, reviews and approves the criteria/medical policies that are used to compare against the treatment plan requests. These policies are based on quidelines of the:

- American Society for Radiation Oncology (ASTRO)
- American College of Radiology (ACR)
- National Comprehensive Cancer Network (NCCN)
- American Medical Association (AMA)


The criteria utilized by eviCore Medical Directors have been vetted by an expert physician review board of nationally recognized radiation oncologists to ensure that authorizations are consistent with published research and guidelines. Peer-to-peer conversations for non-covered or partially covered treatment plans will always be conducted with a board-certified radiation oncologist.
